

Happy Birthday Hill Building

Sibford School dates back to 1842 when it was set up by the Society of Friends at the Manor House in Sibford Ferris, just across the road from the current main school entrance.

The manor continued to be used as part of the school until as recently as 2001. However, the current campus was founded in 1929 when it was decided to extend the school and build a brand new building 'up the hill' from the manor.

Work on that building was completed the following year and the official opening ceremony was performed by Dame Elizabeth Cadbury on 20th



June 1930 who declared it: 'open and free from debt'.

So it's happy 80th birthday to the Hill Building!
